## Summer Camp IMPORTANT INFORMATION!!

### Parent Notes: Please Read!

- All staff are First Aid and CPR certified by the American Safety and Health Institute.
  - Water will be available to the participants while they are at camp.
  - The "buddy system" will be in use at all times to ensure the safety of your child.
  - In the case of a heat emergency, activity will be limited and possibly indoors.
  - In the event of rain, depending upon location, camp may be moved indoors *or* cancelled at the discretion of the camp director.
  - Due to the outdoor nature of the camps, there is the possibility that your child may come into contact with Poison Ivy, Poison Oak, or similarly irritating plants.
- CAMPERS WILL NEED TO BRING:** Sunscreen, a non-perishable Snack, a Water Bottle, Rain Gear, Tennis Shoes/Boots.
- Campers MAY NOT Bring:** Electronic entertainment (mp3 players, handheld gaming devices, etc); Knives; Fire-Making Devices (matches, sparkers, lighters, etc).
- The parent or guardian whose name appears on the Participant Information Sheet **must** sign the camper *in and out* every day.
  - Photo identification **must** be presented at sign-in and sign-out.
  - If someone whose name is not listed on the Participant Information Sheet will be picking the camper up, we must have a signed note from the parent or guardian in advance, indicating that they give their permission for that person to pick their child up. Their photo identification must be shown at sign-out.
- Staff are not permitted to administer medication of any sort. If your child will need medication while camp is in session, staff can hold the medication until the child asks for it. They can not be responsible for the administration of any medication, OTC, prescription, or otherwise.
  - Please apply sunscreen to your child before camp begins each day- staff are not permitted to apply sunscreen to campers.
  - Please do not send a sick child to camp. In the event that a camper becomes ill, we will contact the emergency phone numbers on their Participant Information Sheet. In the event of a medical emergency, we will call 911 first, and then contact the emergency contacts on the Participant Information Sheet. Please be certain all numbers are current.
